Workshop A: Friday, June 12, 10:45 a.m.-12 noon

1. **“Connections, Conflicts, and Mutual Care: How Do We Do This Whole ‘Christians in Community Thing’ Anyway?” – Sarah Leer** In this workshop, we will discuss practical, tangible ways to participate in the **2026-27 Bible study**. We will explore ideas of unity and connectedness, which are woven throughout Paul’s first letter to the Corinthians. We’ll examine relationships, how we care for each other, and points of conflict in Christian community.
2. **“Beyond the Binary: Worshiping an Expansive God” – Sarah Wiles** This workshop will be an exploration of current gender theory and scriptural understandings of gender. We’ll talk about how the Bible is affirming of all people of all genders and how our faith can motivate work for trans rights and inclusion in the church and beyond.
3. **“Jesus and Justice: Faith and Faithful Action” – Ivy Lopedito and Christina Cosby** What does it mean to follow Jesus in a world hungry for justice? This conversation invites people of all ages to explore how faith can lead to meaningful, sustainable action. Whether you’re hopeful, weary, or simply curious, you are welcome to come listen, learn, and imagine what faithful action can look like today.
4. **“More Than ‘Just’: PW Resources Support PW Community” – Carissa Herold** A PW/*Horizons* Bible study, a PW note card, or a downloadable installation service is more than “just” a Bible study, a note card, or an installation service. Each is developed and available to support and enhance our ministry as faithful believers, aligned around the PW Purpose. Learn the many resources available and how each resource’s purpose ultimately supports our Purpose! **Offered only once.**

Workshop B: Friday, June 12, 1:45 p.m.-3 p.m.

1. **“Etched in Our Hearts: Sharing Experiences That Build an Inclusive, Caring Community” – Stephanie Patterson** Our lives are shaped by experiences that leave lasting marks on our hearts. Some stories are shared openly; some are deeply personal—but all matter. We’ll explore a process for sharing life experiences. We’ll listen to stories, share differences, and examine how storytelling can strengthen empathy, deepen connection, and help us build a more inclusive, caring community.
2. **“Because She Was Revolutionary – Reimagining the Space of Presbyterian Women” – Kelsey Law** You are invited to honor the legacy of PW and propel the spaces of PW forward. In a time when we are seeking authentic community, faithful mission engagement, and meaningful justice advocacy, PW is uniquely positioned to respond. Reimagining the space of PW calls for courageous belonging, shared leadership, and fresh imagination. We’ll rethink the room, reshape the story, and reignite what’s possible for PW.
